SUBJECT: STERILE DRESSING CHANGE

PURPOSE: To cleanse the wound, promote wound healing, and prevent infection for a

patient with a wound that the physician has ordered sterile technique for

dressing changes.

CONSIDERATIONS

Wound is free of infection and shows evidence of healing. Pain is minimized during the procedure and anxiety is reduced.

Necessary Equipment	
Sterilized instruments, if needed	Prescribed cleansers, debriders, and topical
(scissors)	antimicrobials, antibiotics
Trash bag (double bag)	Sterile dressings
Gloves	Sterile Q-tips
Tape/bandage	Sterile gloves
Sterile barrier	

	Procedure	
1.	Explain procedure to patient	
2.	Assist patient to obtain a comfortable position,	
	allowing easy access to the wound.	
3.	Wash hands, put on examining gloves	
4.	Loosen and remove old dressing and discard	
5.	Remove gloves and wash hands	
6.	Prepare sterile field, touching exterior	
	wrapping only. Drop <u>all necessary</u> dressings	
	onto sterile field and prepare prescribed	
	treatments. Don sterile gloves.	
7.	Cleanse wound as prescribed by physician.	
8.	Apply ordered dressing.	
9.	Secure dressing.	
10.	Wash hands.	
11.	Document wound status and notify physician	
	of changes.	

Rationale	
To reduce anxiety and obtain consent.	
To prevent cross-contamination	
To maintain a sterile field	
To remove exudate and devitalized tissue.	
Note wound color, size, depth weekly.	
Presence of drainage and amount, color	
consistency and odor, new onset or	
exacerbation of pain, quality of periwound	
tissue, and, if patient is diabetic,	
unexplained change in blood sugar levels.
