







# Other venous embolism & phlebitis 2019

- Coders are referred to nonspecific codes:
  - □ phlebitis and thrombophlebitis of other deep vessels of lower extremities (I80.29-),
  - acute embolism and thrombosis of other specified deep vein of lower extremity (182.49-)
  - chronic embolism and thrombosis of other specified deep vein of lower extremity (I82.59-)
- Not sufficient because "other specified deep vein" should be documented as either proximal or distal
  - Greater specificity required








# Adverse effects, poisoning, underdosing & toxic effects Official Coding Guidelines I.C.19.e.4

- If two or more drugs, medicinal or biological substances are taken, code each individually unless a combination code is listed in the Table of Drugs and Chemicals.
- If multiple unspecified drugs, medicinal or biological substances were taken, assign the appropriate code from subcategory T50.91, Poisoning by, adverse effect of and underdosing of multiple unspecified drugs, medicaments and biological substances.
- For a multiple drug ingestion, unspecified (NOS)

  - □ Includes: injury to law enforcement official, suspect and bystander
  - □ Added new devices such as taser; stun gun

# Sequencing of Sepsis Official Coding Guidelines I.C.1.d.4

- If severe sepsis is present on admission, and meets the definition of principal diagnosis, the underlying systemic infection should be assigned as principal diagnosis followed by the appropriate code from subcategory R65.2- as required by the sequencing rules in the Tabular List. A code from subcategory R65.2- can never be assigned as a principal diagnosis.
- If the reason for admission is or sepsis or severe sepsis and a localized infection, such as pneumonia or cellulitis, a code(s) for the underlying systemic infection should be assigned first and the code for the localized infection should be assigned as a secondary diagnosis. If the patient has severe sepsis, a code from subcategory R65.2- should also be assigned as a secondary diagnosis.
- If the patient is admitted with a localized infection, such as pneumonia, and sepsis/severe sepsis doesn't develop until after admission, the localized infection should be assigned first, followed by the appropriate sepsis/severe sepsis

# Zika Virus Official Coding Guidelines I.C.1.f.1

- Allows for documentation from the provider not just from an MD.
- Code only a confirmed diagnosis of Zika virus (A92.5, Zika virus disease) as documented by the provider. This is an exception to the hospital inpatient guideline Section II, H. In this context, "confirmation" does not require documentation of the type of test performed; the provider's diagnostic statement that the condition is confirmed is sufficient.

# Uncertain Diagnosis Official Coding Guidelines II.H

- If the diagnosis documented at the time of discharge is qualified as "probable," "suspected," "likely," "questionable," "possible," or "still to be ruled out," "compatible with," "consistent with," or other similar terms indicating uncertainty, code the condition as if it existed or was established. The bases for these guidelines are the diagnostic workup, arrangements for further workup or observation, and initial therapeutic approach that correspond most closely with the established diagnosis.
- Note: This guideline is applicable only to inpatient admissions to short-term, acute, long-term care and psychiatric hospitals.

# Physeal Fractures in Children Official Coding Guidelines I.C.19.b.3

- Physeal fractures
- Salter-Harris fractures
  - □ Type I IV
- Important to differentiate from other injuries because the involvement of the physis (growth plate) may cause premature closure resulting in limb shortening and abnormal growth.
- S59.20-
- For physeal fractures, assign only the code identifying the type of physeal fracture. Do not assign a separate code to identify the specific bone that is fractured.
