IV Medication Clinical Fact Sheet**

IV Medication: Ondansetron Hydrochloride/Zofran Risk Level: n/a

Med Class: Anti-emetic

Common Uses: Prevent/treat nausea and vomiting

Labs to Monitor: BUN, Cr, LFTs

Instructions/Precautions: Orthostatic Hypotension, Electrlyte imbalances, CHF, Bradychardia, Diahrrea, fever, headache. Report blurred vision; Can be given IV Push, 4 mg or less over 2-5 minutes
