IV Medication: Infliximab / Remicade Risk Level: 1

Med Class: Monoclonal Antibody

Common Uses: Rheumatoid Arthritis, Crohn's Disease,
Psoriatic Arthritis

Labs to Monitor: CBC with Diff

Instructions/Precautions: Hypersensitivity reaction; monitor BP and
Pulse q 30min during infusion; CHF may
occur or worsen; flu-like symptoms, serious
infections and malignancies may occur; pre-
meds frequently used; secondary infusion
uses 1.2 filter; do not give if active infection
