IV Medication Clinical Fact Sheet**

IV Medication: Eravacycline/Xerava Risk Level: NA
Med Class: Tetracycline Antibiotic

Common Uses: Bacterial Infections
Labs to Monitor: BUN, Cr, LFTs, WBC

Instructions/Precautions: For use in complicated intra-abdominal Infections. Avoid with history of tetracycline allergy. Site infections, mild to moderate nausea/vomiting/diarrhea, potential Clostridium difficile associated diarrhea (CDAD), development of hypersensitivity, photosensitivity, pancreatitis, abnormal liver function tests, increased BUN.

Notes: Only drugs listed as First Dose Allowed may be given in the home as a first dose and are considered for a first dose on a case by case basis by the IV Program Manager

1= IV Program Mgr or Clinical Director approval before referral is accepted
2= IV Program Mgr notification; Clinicians must review Special Instructions
