## Star Rating/Value Based Purchasing

Ambulation is one of the Star Rating and Value Based Purchasing questions. The information below will give you guidance for answering the question.

**(M1860) Ambulation/Locomotion:** Current ability to walk **safely**, once in a standing position, or use a wheelchair, once in a seated position, on a variety of surfaces.

- 0 Able to independently walk on even and uneven surfaces and negotiate stairs with or without railings (specifically: needs no human assistance or assistive device).
- 1 With the use of a one-handed device (for example, cane, single crutch, hemi-walker), able to independently walk on even and uneven surfaces and negotiate stairs with or without railings.
- 2 Requires use of a two-handed device (for example, walker or crutches) to walk alone on a level surface and/or requires human supervision or assistance to negotiate stairs or steps or uneven surfaces.
- 3 Able to walk only with the supervision or assistance of another person at all times
- 4 Chair fast, unable to ambulate but is able to wheel self independently.
- 5 Chairfast, unable to ambulate and is unable to wheel self.
- 6 Bedfast, unable to ambulate or be up in a chair.

## **Guidelines for Assessment**

- Score patient prior to any teaching/interventions
- Start from the bottom and work your way up -the patient must be able to complete all tasks at that level, if not go back down to previous level
- Observation is required to obtain accurate information
- The clinician must consider what the patient is ABLE TO DO safely on the day of the assessment
- You must document limitations in the note to match choices on the Oasis
- Consider the risk for potential injury/fall
- If the patient requires verbal cues to slow down, for pacing, to use device, or
  to use device appropriately then they require supervision and they are at least
  a 3 for amb
- Would you be surprised if you got a report that the patient fell? –No, then they need supervision and they are at least **3 for amb**
- Is the patient **safe?** NO, then pt is at least a **3 for amb**
- Does the pt have the needed assistive device? No, then they are at least a 3 for amb
- Is the pt using walls and furniture yes- then they are least a 3 for amb
- Did the pt score greater than a 3 on the Mahc 10? Yes, then they are at risk for falls and at least a **3** for amb
